


Social transfers, reduction of inequalities, and poverty reduction are investments in support of ambitious climate policy goals.

- 1. EU citizens have differing views on just transition. Most Hungarians believe the wealthiest 50% should reduce energy consumption, while most Poles think it's the responsibility of the wealthiest 10-20%.
- 2. Immediate financial constraints, inequalities and poverty reduce the support for ambitious climate policy goals.
- 3. Use the available 37.5% of the funds allocated to your country in the Social Climate Fund for transfers.

Most Hungarians believe the wealthiest 50% should reduce energy consumption, while most Poles think it's the responsibility of the wealthiest 10-20%.





Immediate financial constraints, inequalities and poverty reduce the support for ambitious climate policy goals.








- No, you are not willing to pay more even though you could afford to do so
